As we continue to learn how to live, work and educate amidst this global pandemic, we are continuously evaluating our policies and how they fit within the framework of the medical guidance we receive and the scenarios that we encounter.

In light of New York and New Jersey currently allowing for social events to take place, several families have requested further clarification from the school regarding our policies, guidance and protocols as they relate to both hosting and attending events.

These policies are meant to guide you as you make or attend events and we expect full compliance from our school community including students and parents.

We remind you that these policies are fluid and will continue to be re examined as the situation and our experiences evolve.

Has your child attended a large gathering/event within the last 14 days which did not comply with the applicable state guidelines for large events, including adherence to all mask and social distancing requirements by all guests?

We can not stress enough that, in order for our safety policies to be effective, and to protect your children, our teachers and our community by extension, your full compliance is essential. Accordingly, failure to comply with these policies will result in serious consequences including but not limited to a family's suspension from in-person learning.
